

LABORSHED AREA

To determine the boundaries of a Laborshed area, local employers supply the residential ZIP codes of each of their employees. 




The Laborshed survey collects information regarding the **out commute** for an employment center.

The out commute for Humboldt is estimated at 35.5 percent—approximately 888 people living in Humboldt work in other communities.

Most of those who are out commuting are working in Fort Dodge and Pocahontas.

Over one-third (38.5%) of out commuters are likely to change employment (approximately 342 people).

53.8% earn an hourly wage—median wage is \$20.00/hour 33.3% earn an annual salary—median salary is \$80,500/year

**Insufficient survey data/refused. A lack of data for a particular industry is not necessarily indicative that there were no (or few) individuals surveyed within that industry. Rather, it may be that there simply were no respondents within that industry that also reported that they are likely to change or accept employment.

Note: A wide variety of occupations are included within these industry categories. Industry classification is based upon the respondent's reported current or former employer. Two respondents that work for a manufacturer will be classified within the manufacturing industry even if, for example, one respondent is a custodian and the other is an accountant.

UNDEREMPLOYMENT

The underemployed are working fewer than 35 hours per week but desire more hours (**inadequate hours**); in positions that do not meet their skill or education level, or have worked for higher wages at previous employment (**mismatch of skills**); or are earning wages equal to or less than the national poverty level and work 35 or more hours per week (**low income**).
